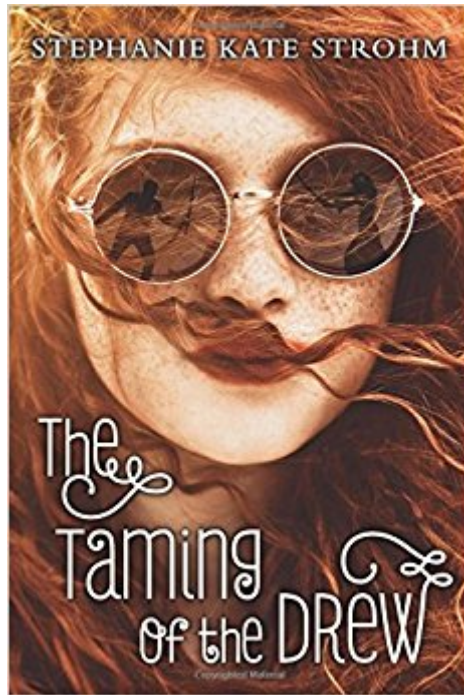

The way the author peppers actual Shakespearean verse into the calamities and conversations feels natural and unique; it's not just a nominal connection for a witty title. Strohm flips *The Taming of the Shrew* on its head believably. I wouldn't mind a sequel!
