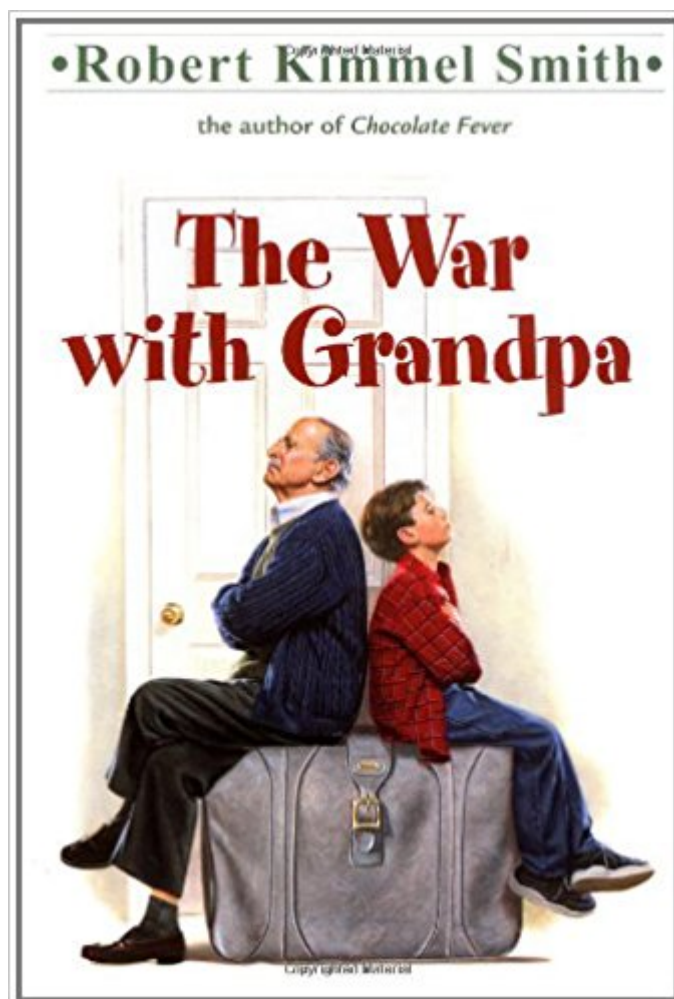

Kids love practical jokes. And they love the idea of playing practical jokes on adults even more, particularly when the adult in question is temporarily brought down to the same level as the kid. This was a favorite book of mine when it was first published because it perfectly brings those common child fantasies to life in a realistic manner. Pete is angry when he learns that his grandfather will be coming to live with him and will be taking over Pete's bedroom. After giving his grandfather an ultimatum, Pete declares war on his grandfather, and in this case war takes the form of an escalating series of pranks. Grandpa sees the war as an amusing diversion, and he responds in kind. But by the end of the book, both combatants find themselves trapped in a situation that they would rather avoid. This book artfully captures the dynamics of family relationships. Pete and his

grandfather love each other, and yet their love is confused by the fights that they have.

Kimmel-Smith does a great job of depicting the conflicted emotions that children feel for their family members. I highly recommend this book to any young reader. It is a very entertaining read, and will be a pleasant way to pass an evening or two.

Very enjoyable read aloud!
