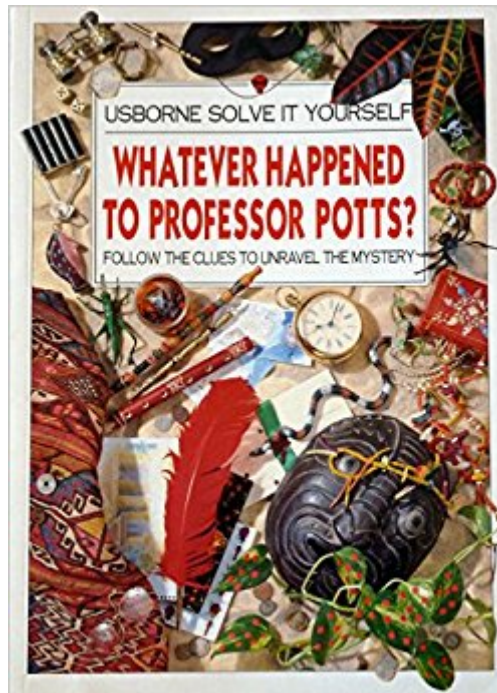

It gave enough information for each puzzle to get her thinking about it and keep her challenged. The clues in the back, for when you get stuck, are very helpful as well. The answers are in the very back, but you really need someone else to check them for you so you don't see the answers to the next puzzle. I wish they could have put the answers in a lift-and-look or some similar format, so you don't see ahead unless you want to. Overall, though, I think this book is fabulous (as did my daughter) and we are excited to get more!
